

KS2 Prior Language Knowledge

- Changes from the Stone Age to Iron Age.

- Struggle for power between the Saxons and Vikings.
- Ancient Greece, its achievements and their influence on the western world.

The Norman Conquest

Students learn of the impact the Norman Conquest had on Britain. This provides students with a wider understanding of the period in British history that still holds significance today.



Medieval Monarchs

Students learn of the different challenges to medieval monarchs from the Church, nobility and the people (Henry II and Thomas Becket; King John, the barons and signing Magna Carta; Richard II and the Peasants' Revolt)



Change and Continuity

Students begin their learning by comparing the Black Death and Great Plague to investigate change and continuity.

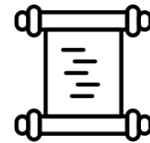


Spring Term 1
