



Dear Parents / Carers,



I cannot believe that we are already at the final full week of schooling for our Year 11 learners. They have been brilliant during the examination season. Below I have included a few final points that will help you support us in navigating the final events in our Year 11 calendar.



Final Exams

We are not finished yet. As our Year 11 are tired we have seen very small numbers arriving late or wanting to leave early. Leaving an exam before the allowed time can result in a paper being cancelled and a U grade being awarded. We have made every effort to ensure that everyone is supported during the stressful exam season. Please keep us posted if you need support with your child over the coming days.



Wednesday 12th June

This will be the final day of formal schooling for Year 11 although they officially remain on our roll until Friday 28th June. From Thursday 13th June we will expect Year 11 in school for planned booster sessions and examinations only. They should still attend school in full uniform for revision sessions and exams.



The day will run as a regular school day. I have, this morning, outlined the expectations for that day

1. Attend lessons / exams as normal and engage with the revision in these lessons.
2. Bring a **spare shirt** for signing (not the one you are wearing).
3. Do not wander the corridors looking for staff and students to sign books / shirts during lesson time.

These basic expectations enable us to ensure the final day is enjoyable for all and that learning in Years 7-10 is not disrupted. I do not wish to send anyone home before the leaver's assembly, but having been so clear with students I will have no hesitation in doing so if the smooth running of the school site is disrupted. I am hopeful, given the brilliant conduct of the year group so far, that this will not be necessary.

This is a real highlight of the school calendar for us. The event has always passed smoothly with staff and students celebrating their time together at WHS. We have many staff who want to come along and supervise it. There has never been an issue in my time here and I don't anticipate any different this year, however where behaviour is poor or students arrive under the influence of alcohol or other substances they will be refused entry. This is, in effect still a children's party and will be treated as such to ensure that everyone is able to enjoy the evening planned.
